# Lewistown Campus Renovations Begin

Earlier this week the Birdwell Builders began the first phase of the renovations on the former BLM building in Lewistown. They have begun to rip out the carpets, walls and other elements that are not part of the new design. The renovation will take the entire summer to complete and the building is scheduled to be open for classes this fall. This project began ten years ago; fund-raising began 5 years ago with a half-million dollar grant from HUD and \$633,500 raised from Central Montana donations. Special thanks to Diane Oldenburg and The Central Montana Education Center for all of their hard work and for making this project a reality.

This day is the result of a 1986 Congressional resolution and is designed to focus the nation's "attention on the needs of disadvantaged young people and adults aspiring to improve their lives". TRIO is a federally funded grant program that funds our Student Support Services, Educational Opportunity Centers and our Veterans Upward Bound programs.

The benefit performance of Eve Ensler's "The Vagina Monologues" opens next week at MSU-Northern. Produced by ReSPECT, MSU-Northern's ReSPONSE Peer Education Campus Theatre, the production will be held in the SUB Ballroom, beginning at 8:00 p.m. Dates and ticket prices are as follows:

Saturday's events also include live music by Kevin Campbell, raffle drawings for donated artworks by two Northern students (David Waters and Will Lorett) and a Northern professor (Mariann Miller), and a V-Day basket of goods and services donated by Havre and Chinook merchants. Raffle tickets are available from cast members, the ReSPONSE office and at the door; you need not be present to win.

Annual productions of "The Vagina Monologues" on campuses around the world benefit V-Day, an international non-profit organization raising awareness and funds to end violence against women and girls worldwide. Each year, V-Day designates a focus group as international beneficiary; in 2007, the focus is "Women in Conflict Zones." A local beneficiary is also chosen and this year the local designee is Stone Child College's Domestic Abuse Program, which is a grant partner with MSU-Northern's ReSPONSE.

Student Support Services (SSS) is one of three federally funded TRIO grant programs at Montana State University-Northern. SSS has been a part of Northern since 1979. During that time Northern has received approximately 4.5 million dollars to help more than 5,000 disadvantaged students. The other two programs are the Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) which began at Northern in 1991 and the Veteran's Upward Bound (VUB) program, which is located on the MSU-billings campus and began the following year in 1992.
