MSU-Northern Visits Lethbridge College



Northwest of Havre is the town of Lethbridge Alberta (population 80,000). This community is home to the University Lethbridge (8,000 students) and Lethbridge College (3,500 students). Alex Capdeville, Joe Callahan, and Jim Potter visited Lethbridge College this week to open the dialog on developing some block transfer agreements. Their administration had some excellent ideas on how the two colleges can work together to provide options for their students. Lethbridge College used to be called Lethbridge College, it changed its name to reflect its broad mission but it is still a two-year college.

ABET Accreditation Visit

A team of 2 people from the Accreditation Board of Engineering Technology (ABET) will be on campus from November 10-14 to evaluate our Civil Engineering Program.

ABET accreditation provides the assurance that Northern's CET program meets the quality standards established by the engineering profession. ABET accredits postsecondary degree-granting programs housed within regionally accredited institutions. ABET accredits programs only, not departments, colleges, or institutions. In Montana, a graduate from Northern's CET program is allowed to write the state engineering exam and be a licensed engineer. There are only about 6 states which allow technology programs to write the exam.

This year Northern's Christmas tree lighting ceremony will be held on Friday November 30th at 4:30 p.m. in the Cowan Hall lobby in front of the Registrar's office. Refreshments will be served and everyone is invited.

Caterpillar Foundation Donates \$10K



Windows XP Tip: Move Your Taskbar

By default, the Microsoft Windows XP taskbar (which shows buttons for each of your open windows) sits at the bottom of your screen. That's fine if you don't open many windows. If you have more than six or seven windows open at a time, however, the taskbar can become extremely crowded. To make more room for windows, move your taskbar to the right or left side of the screen, where it will be displayed vertically, giving you room for more than a dozen windows.

To move your taskbar:

- Right-click your taskbar in an empty area, some of the Taskbar properties will appear. If there is a check mark beside Lock the Taskbar on the shortcut menu, click Lock the Taskbar to unlock it.
- Drag your taskbar to the left, right, or top of your screen. To drag the taskbar, click and hold the mouse button on an empty area of the taskbar. Then, while holding down the mouse button, drag the taskbar to its new location. When the taskbar is in place, release the mouse button.
- Move the pointer over an edge of the taskbar until the pointer changes to a double-headed arrow. Click the mouse button, and drag the edge of the taskbar to widen it. When you can read enough of the window titles, release the mouse button.
- Finally, to prevent your taskbar from being accidentally moved, right-click your taskbar, and click Lock the Taskbar on the shortcut menu.
