These engines were purchased through Modern Machinery who also had their representatives John Scott and Robert Ridgeway on hand for the training. Modern Machinery donated \$20,000 last year for scholarships for Northern's diesel students.

Graduation Information

Graduates: If you have not turned in your graduation papers to the Registrar's office you need to do so ASAP as they were due in December. If you plan on walking during the graduation ceremonies, you will need graduation attire. Students graduating with a master's degree must place your order for apparel the Northern Bookstore by February 29th. If you are not sure you will be graduating it is recommended that you place your order anyway. It can always be cancelled, but absolutely cannot be ordered late, as orders take eight weeks at minimum to receive in. You can place orders by phone, fax, e-mail or in person. The information needed will be name, height, weight, and degree.

*Special note: Undergrads watch for signs announcing the arrival of graduation apparel which does not need to be specially ordered. Simply stop in the bookstore and pick it up. The cost is \$20.00. Also, on order are announcements. Their arrival will be advertised as well. These are available on a first come, first serve basis. They will cost ten dollars for a pack of ten.

File Your Montana Income Tax Online

This year you have more options for electronically filing your Montana individual income tax forms. For tax year 2007, you'll find free (yes, free!) electronic filing for these popular forms on their website:

- 2EZ short form
- 2M intermediate form

We invite you to log onto their website to learn more at: <u>mt.gov/revenue</u>. Electronic filing is simple, secure and convenient. It results in fewer errors and faster refunds. You can even make an electronic payment if you have a tax obligation. Combining electronic filing with direct deposit will provide the quickest possible refund. The typical wait time for a refund is 5 -10 days for an efiled return or 6-10 weeks for a paper return.

Emailing Outlook Contacts

If you want to share information from one or more of your Outlook contacts with others, here's how: In the folder that contains the contact(s) you want to send, do one of the following:

- click the contact that you want to forward,
 To select multiple contacts, press CTRL while clicking the contacts.
 To select all the contacts in the folder, press CTRL A
- 2. Right-click, and point to Send Full Contact.
- 3. Click In Internet Format (vCard). Because you don't know for sure if all your recipients are using the same version of Outlook as you are, this is the safest way to share contact information.
- 4. Then all you have to do is address the email & ship it off!

 The recipient(s) can then drag & drop the contact(s) to their Contact folder. **Northern**
