Montana's SkillsUSA held their 40th annual State Leadership & Skills Conference on the MSU-Northern campus this week. MSU-Northern has hosted the event since 1972. SkillsUSA is a nationally based club for high school and college students that offers competitive opportunities through which students are able to learn the skills needed for their specific area of interest in the workforce. Dedicated SkillsUSA students from around the state gathered to participate in the various competitions this week. SkillsUSA is a well-participated club in Montana- with 33 schools participating and bringing 375 students to compete, 275 judges, and 58 advisors. The categories available included Quiz Bowl, welding, automotive service technology, various drafting opportunities, diesel technology, carpentry, cabinet making, 3-D visual animation, and many others. The winners of each category have an opportunity to compete on a national level this summer. 

Ted Turner to Speak at MSU-Northern's Commencement

Saturday, May the 7th marks the end of another academic year at Montana State University-Northern. This year's graduating class will have the opportunity to hear from one the nation's most famous entrepreneurs when Robert Edward Turner III, known to much of the world as Ted Turner will speak at MSU-Northern's Commencement Ceremony. Turner has deep connections with our great state. His 113,000 acre ranch- Flying D Ranch- in southwestern Montana focuses on bison herd management, reintroduction of the West Slope Cutthroat trout, and wolf population recovery. Turner even named his restaurant after Montana. In January of 2002 the first "Ted's Montana Grill" was opened in Ohio. "Turner's Montana Grill" has expanded greatly since then, encompassing 46 restaurants nationwide. Montana's branch of the

restaurant lies within the Baxter Hotel in Bozeman.

These are only a few of the many accomplishments Turner has achieved. His connections with Montana are tiny fragments of how widely influential Turner is and has been. Northern is very honored to welcome Ted Turner to its 2011 Commencement Ceremony.

Business Problem Solving Competition

On April 11-12 students attending two-year colleges throughout Montana spent one and a half days developing solutions to a real problem which was posed by the USDA - Gallatin National Forest. The competition provided the opportunity for students to hone their business and problem solving skills while working with their faculty advisors.

Insert a Screenshot in a Message

When you want to save a thousand words by e-mailing a picture of a dialog box, browser screen or anything else that appears on your desktop:

- 1. Open a new mail message,
- 2. While in the body of the message click on the **Insert** tab, then in the **Illustrations** section click **Screenshot**.
- 3. A dialog box shows you all the windows currently open on your desktop. You can:
 - a. Choose the window you want to insert by clicking it, ~or~
 - b. You can click on Screen Clipping at the bottom of the dialog box. Your screen will fade and then you can use the mouse to click to draw a box on screen. When you release the mouse button after drawing your box, the area you selected will be inserted into your message.

Note: Although this is a handy tool, please use it judiciously - the screenshots and screen clippings are very large files!
