Computer Corner

Office 2007/2010 Tip A quick way to add items to the Quick Access Toolbar

If an Office 2007 or 2010 command that you use a lot is buried under too many tabs and groups, you can easily add that command to the Quick Access Toolbar (QAT). In 2007 the QAT are those little icons that are found next to the Office button in the upper left hand corner of Office programs. 2010 doesn't have the Office button, so the icons are just at the top of an Office window on the left hand side.

There is more than one way to add items to the QAT, but probably the quickest method for adding a command is this:

- 1. Right-click an individual tool, option or command.
- 2. Choose the Add To Quick Access Toolbar option.

You can use this same technique to add an entire group to the QAT: Simply right-click on a group's title bar.
