

Office 2013 Changing those annoying ALL CAPS TAB TITLES

One thing you may notice when using Office 2013 is that the names of all the tabs on the ribbon are in all CAPS. If this "shouty" display bothers you, you can change them back to mixed case. Here's how:

- 1. Click on File,
- 2. then **Options**,
- 3. and select Customize Ribbon.
- 4. Highlight the name of tab you want to change in the right pane and
- 5. Use the **Rename** button to change the name. BUT rather than retyping the name, you can simply add a space at the end of the name and click **OK**.

The updates to the tabs will display when you return to the document. Unfortunately, to change them all you will have to do each and every tab, and in every application you use.
