Solid Finances Webinar - April 22

The next Solid Finances Webinar will take place April 22 from 12-1 p.m. in the Vande Bogart Library Computer Lab. It is titled: "Responding to Change: Diminished Capacity, the Aging Population, and Financial Decisions."

Diminished capacity is a growing problem that can affect our financial picture. As the baby-boomer generation continues to reach retirement age in ever increasing numbers, the issue of diminished capacity is taking on a new and growing significance. The United States is the wealthiest country in the world and 75% of that wealth is concentrated in the hands of approximately 70 million people who, as they age, may be more likely to fall prey to fraud as a result of diminished capacity. It is incumbent to adapt to this emerging reality, address the accompanying issues in proactive ways and develop tools to lessen the impact on the financial life of those affected by diminished capacity. This presentation will help people protect their parents, siblings, clients, and even themselves before, during, and after diminished capacity begins.

Are you ready for fulltime employment after graduation in May? Do you still need help with your resume, cover letter, and interviewing tips? Come to the Career Center for help with these items as soon as you can, and avoid waiting until the last minute!

Also, if any students are planning to take summer co-op credits, they need to come to the Career Center as soon as possible to sign up. They will need to have the co-op information ready to add to their profiles on CareerExpress including their employer's name and contact information. Students also need to check with Financial Aid to be sure they are prepared to pay for these credits throughout the summer. Payment schedules need to be taken care of with the Business Office.

All students who register for a summer co-op are encouraged to attend a workshop. Three workshops will be given and each student needs to attend one. These workshops are designed to instruct the students on how the co-ops work, what documentation they are responsible for and learn the rules regarding co-ops as well. These workshops will be held in the Library Computer Lab (downstairs) on the following dates:
