MSU-Northern Celebrates 95 Years



Montana State University-Northern is celebrating a monumental milestone—our 95th anniversary was held this week, on September 24, 2024. Founded in 1929 as Northern Montana College, MSU-Northern has upheld nearly a century of "education that works." Over the years, the institution has grown from humble beginnings into a vibrant part of Montana's higher education system.

Some of the many highlights of the past 95 years are:

- Northern Montana College (NMC) began with 80 students on September 24, 1929
- Dr. G.H. Vande Bogart was the school's first president.
- East Hall became the first permanent building on campus in 1932
- Now we have over 25 buildings

- We have had 17 Presidents/Chancellors
- NMC officially changed its name to Montana State University-Northern in 1994

With nearly a century behind us, MSU-Northern stands as a pillar of education on the Hi-Line, and the next five years will bring even more growth as we prepare for our centennial celebration in 2029. Here's to 95 years of education that works, and a bright future ahead!

Fall Scholarship Awards Ceremony



Last Friday (Sept.20), the campus celebrated its annual Scholarship Awards Ceremony. The Awards Ceremony is traditionally held in the Spring, but this year it was held in the fall because of problems with the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) rollout last spring.

This year's ceremony added the inclusion of freshman scholarships. Four hundred and ten (410) academic scholarships totaling \$424,890 to 269 students were awarded at this year's ceremony. This amount does not include any federal grants or loans, state aid, or athletic scholarships. The ceremony also included drawings for \$50 gift cards which were given to Rylin Burn, Taylissa Lytle, Kayla Burchard, Edward Chapman, Airianna Vij, and Blake Fitch. Two \$500 Scholarship winners were also drawn, which went to Taylynn Lindsey and Carmeron O'Neill.

2024 Athletic Hall of Fame Awards Ceremony



On Friday, September 20, six individuals and one team were inducted into the prestigious Northern Athletic Hall of Fame. The ceremony was part of Hall of Fame weekend, and also featured a special recognition during halftime of the Lights' Frontier football matchup against Arizona Christian University on September 21.

This year's honored inductees included Andrew Sellars, Anna Bateman, Thomas VanderMars, Evan Hinebauch, Ted Hill, and Coach Shawn Huse. Additionally, the 2004 national championship Lights wrestling team, coached by David Ray, was celebrated for their outstanding achievements.

The tipi raising took place at the base of the hill near the SUB. Students were invited to participate, assisting in raising the

tipi while learning about its cultural significance. Attendees had the opportunity to ask questions and gain hands-on experience with this traditional practice, making it a meaningful and educational event for all involved. Faculty, staff, and students are welcome to visit the tipi while it remains on display.

Student Spotlight – Kannon Ferestad



Kannon Ferestad, a Bachelor of Diesel Technology student at MSU-Northern, first heard about the university's program through a visit by MSUN faculty to his high school in Scobey, Montana. He initially planned to attend Northern to gain expertise in working on farm equipment, preparing for a future managing the family farm. However, his time at MSU-Northern introduced him to Wartsila, a company in the marine industry, which shifted his interests in a new direction.

During the summer, Kannon landed a co-op with Wartsila, working out of Fort Lauderdale, Florida. In the workshop, he overhauled engine components, diving deep into the mechanics of diesel engines. His role also took him to the Bahamas and Tampa, where he worked on tug boats, overhauling engines and gaining valuable hands-on field service experience.

Beyond technical skills, Kannon was exposed to different cultures, which added a unique dimension to his summer learning. The experience cemented his admiration for Wartsila, both for the quality of the work and the people he met along the way.

Upon graduation, Kannon has already signed on full-time with Wartsila. Working remotely from Scobey, he will fly to jobs when needed, enjoying a perfect balance between his career in the marine industry and managing the family farm—a dual lifestyle that offers him the best of both worlds.


